Dear Parents/Carers,

We have also had the local authority in working with us for two days at the beginning of last week in order to review where we are up to and have had some helpful ideas of how we can continue to improve our core provision and extend opportunities for our children. This meeting will be at 2.30pm on Wednesday 21st February and we will discuss at this first meeting how best to make it inclusive and accessible for maximum engagement and impact. If you haven't already let us know you plan to attend it would be useful to know how many people plan to attend and we can try to have parents representing each class if possible!

Collective Worship continues to be on the theme of courage and this week we used a song from 'The Greatest Showman', 'This is me' by Keala Settle which is a rousing anthem about being proud of who you are.
