Attendance

If you are running late for school and arrive after 9am please remember to bring your child in to school via the main door (even if the gate is unlocked). The registers are taken at 8.55am and so to ensure we know which children are in school it is really important to come in through the main front door. Thank you for your support in safeguarding all the children.



We will be updating our attendance policy shortly and will let you know when this is updated on the website. The school attendance for Term 1 (Sept to Oct) was 95.4%. Our target for the year is 97% overall for the year.

Children who arrive late, often find it difficult to settle into the class, so they lose even more learning time. Please continue to make every effort to get your child(ren) to school on time.

Lunchtime

Just to let everyone know, I felt that the inherited lunchtime arrangements where junior children have to remain in the hall after eating until going back to class is by no means ideal and we have been looking at how we could make this better for our children. Our concrete play area is quite small for the number of children we have, so in order for all children to be able to be outside and be safe following eating we will need to make greater use of the field. This is easier when it is dry weather but more of a challenge when the field is damp or if it is raining.

One of the ideas we are looking at is children wearing their shoes on the field, which will then become muddy, so then removing them to return to the classroom. What would you think about putting slipper socks on your child's Christmas list? I will keep you updated should we have any better ideas about how we can make our lunchtime playtime more successful but please bear with us whilst we try out different ideas. Thanks for your continued support. And feel free to feedback any suggestions you may have!

Dyslexia Friendly Classrooms

Thank you to the number of parents who have raised the issue of our provision for children with dyslexic traits, tendencies or diagnoses. We have been looking at how we can make our classrooms more inclusive of a wider range of children's learning needs and are starting with work to make our classrooms 'dyslexia friendly'. We are putting together a policy which outlines the strategies that we will employ across all our classes as part of everyday good practice. This will include guidance on the use of less contrasting backgrounds/font colours when using the interactive whiteboards, providing bookmarks with include a coloured overlay to support all readers and varying the colour of paper/print that is presented to children, providing an alternative to the stark contrast of black on white which some children struggle with. When our guidance document is complete I will let you know and you will be able to view it on the website or ask us for an email and/or paper copy (on buff paper with blue ink!!).

Online Safety

Please can we remind you to talk to your child about staying safe online. This should be a regular conversation about not giving out personal information, keeping passwords safe and never sharing them and talking about any apps your child may be using. The NSPCC have guidance to support you with keeping children safe online and setting parental controls on your children's devices which will help, especially if you are thinking of Christmas presents that will enable your child to get online!
