Every term at school is a busy one and this term we have enjoyed our annual harvest festival together. Robin Class

What a fun and busy half term we have had! The children settled into the routines wonderfully.

Year 2, along with year 3, have explored the texts *The Heart and the Bottle* and *The Seed of Doubt*. The children have asked lots of questions around the texts, made predictions as well as revisited the importance of using capital letters and full stops! In Maths, the children are enjoying using Numbots/ TTRS to consolidate their number facts and times tables. All children enjoy 'Flashback 4' at the start of each maths session, to recap prior learning.

In the afternoons we have enjoyed learning about seasons and the properties of materials in our Science lessons. Year 2 enjoyed making bridges, folding paper in different ways and seeing how many toy bugs their bridge would hold! Year 1 have created some wonderful seasonal pictures and have explored how the weather changes from Summer to Autumn.

Computing continues to be a firm favourite lesson. This half term we have been using a mouse and keyboard, as well as beginning to 'touch type', using Dance Mat typing to support us. In art, we have been exploring spirals, and enjoyed using huge sheets of paper to make a class collaboration! In PE, the children have been practicing their dribbling skills, and have enjoyed games including Football Traffic Lights and Dance Tag.

The children have enjoyed lots of time outside this half term, especially as part of Muddy Mondays. The children have made rain gauges, leaf and bark rubbings, as well as lots of experiments with water and making shelters!

Reception have settled fantastically and are enjoying acting out stories, as well as making dens for camping trips! As part of their learning about *The Little Red Hen*, the children enjoyed making 'dough', as well as exploring the farm small world and 'cooking' in the home corner. The children have been consolidating numbers 1-3, what these numbers are made up of and recognising them in the environment. Year 1 have enjoyed exploring part-part wholes recently, using concrete

resources to make up the whole number and using language such as '5 is a part and 5 is a part and the whole of me is 10!'

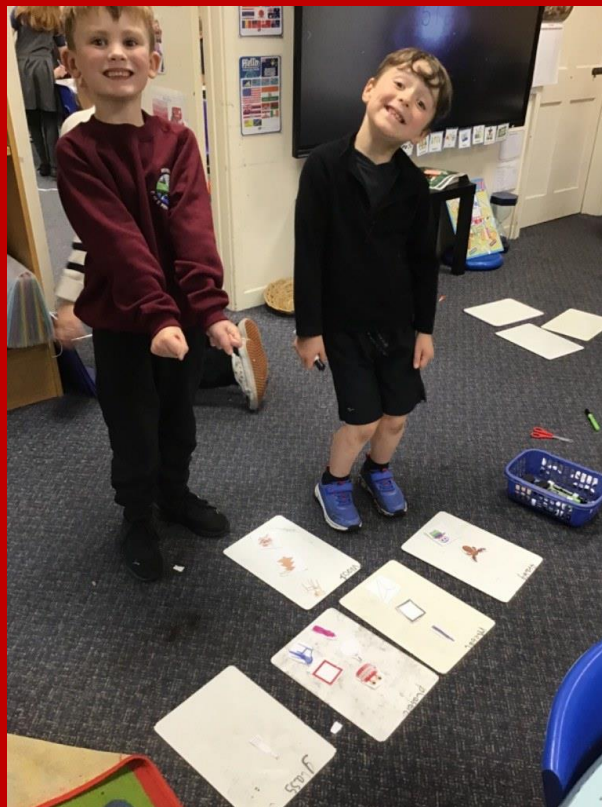
The children have enjoyed exploring the question 'How am I making History?' this half term. They enjoyed sharing photos of when they were younger and making memory boxes, as well as looking at photos of family members and what life might have been like before they were born. 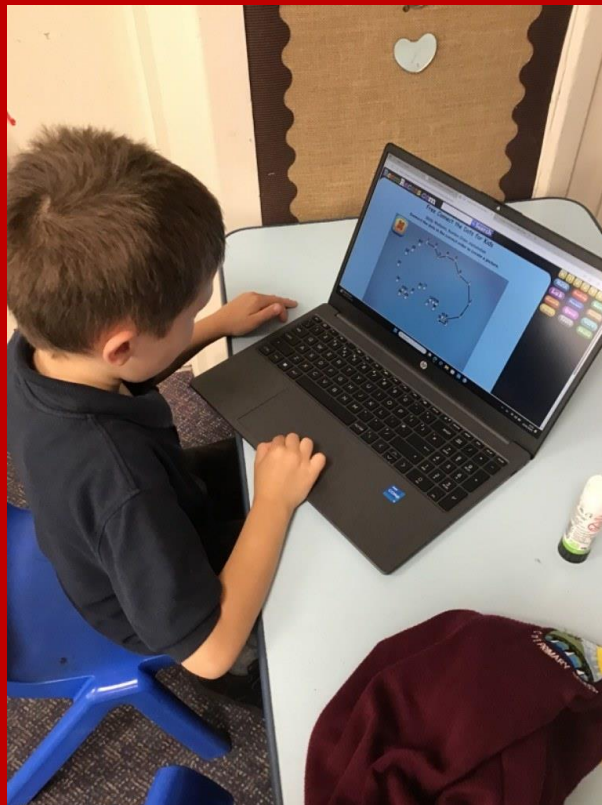
We hope you all have a lovely half term.

Kingfisher Class

What an amazing start to a new academic year. A warm welcome to all returning and new pupils. This year has seen a number of changes and the children have done a wonderful job adjusting to new routines. Well done Kingfishers!

Our English texts have been a huge success. They've engaged the children with ideas out of their comfort zone, taking them to Alaska and India, having them think about the wider world and empathising with characters in difficult situations. Reading is a wonderful and essential life skill and to encourage reading at home the reading raffle is continuing this year. Keep filling in and sending in those reading records!

Maths is a part of our daily routine. Arithmetic practice is a key part of this and an important opportunity to use the basic operation skills (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) as well as recap others such as fractions and decimals.

The children's progress and passion has been seen throughout the curriculum. Highlights include programming using Scratch in computing, role play in history, typography in art and yoga! One of the highlights the children have really enjoyed learning on a Monday, as part of our enrichment opportunities, is sign language. Whilst discussing different lives and experiences, the children were interested in those people who struggle with hearing and those who are deaf. Inspired by this, they wanted to learn sign language. We've been using videos and have currently learnt the signs for animals, colours and family members.

Swimming lessons for years 4, 5 and 6 have been a huge success. The children love being in the pool and it's an important life skill. Lessons continue for a few more weeks after half term.

The Harvest Festival was a wonderful showcase of the whole school. The Year 6s did a fabulous job of preparing and sharing the worship with us and the acrostic poems were a lovely opportunity

for everyone to share a small part of their work. Thank you to everyone for your support and donations.

Homework projects for the next half term up until Christmas have been posted on Seesaw. There are a range of activities to extend, explore and further engage with our topics. Homework projects will be posted before every holiday.

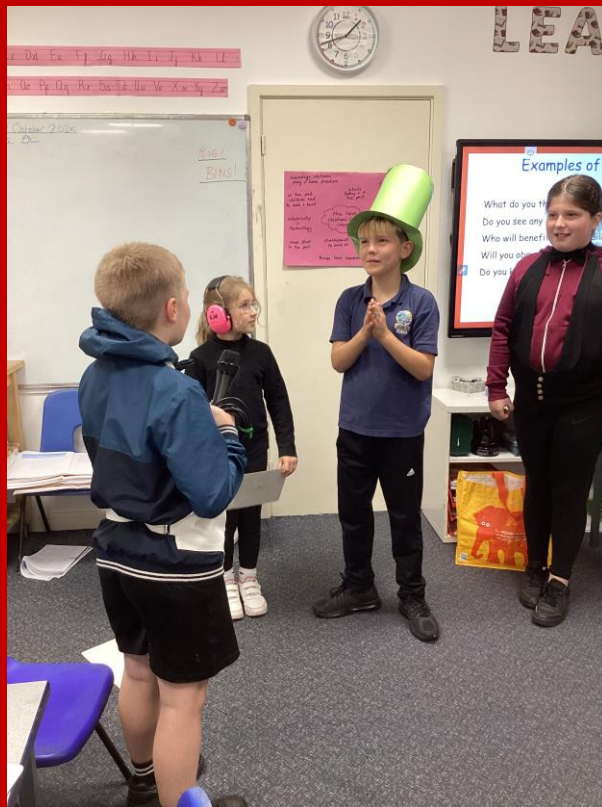
