#### <u>Covid 19</u>

From September, we will no longer be keeping our children in 'bubbles' and it is planned that school will return very much to normal. We will also no longer be operating staggered ends to the day and you will be welcome to return to the playground at drop off and pick up time. If you have booked for a child and they are ill that day, the payment will be credited to your account so you can use it for another lunch in the future.

If you do not book, the fact that your child has taken lunch that day will be added to Parentpay, I aim to do this weekly. I will send out reminders for people who have not paid.

If you do forget to book or send a packed lunch in we will not let your child go hungry and will order a lunch for them, this will be added to your Parentpay account.
