Sunflowers



This half term the Sunflower children have been learning about life cycles. They have been fascinated by the changes of butterflies and frogs. We are currently taking weekly walks down to the moat in the castle grounds to observe the development of the tadpoles.



The children have been extremely engaged in our planting topic. They have created their own mini gardens by decorating a house print out, making a lollipop stick fence using the glue gun, and

planting the mustard seeds in a tray. They have also planted cress heads in yoghurt pots, runner beans in glass jars and flower seeds outside in the garden. The children were then challenged to keep caring for these by understanding their requirements and then comparing their growth: looking at speed, height and labelling the parts of the plants.

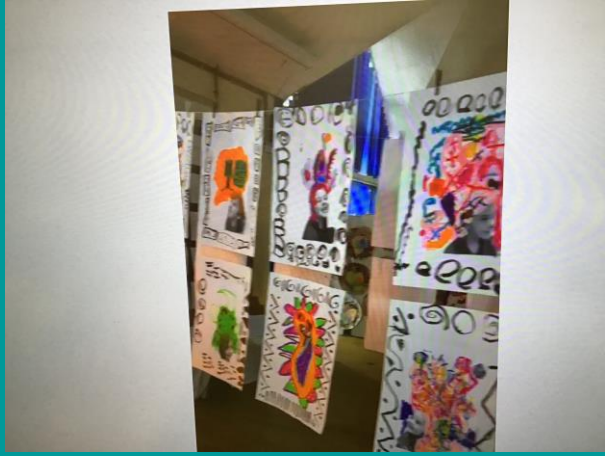
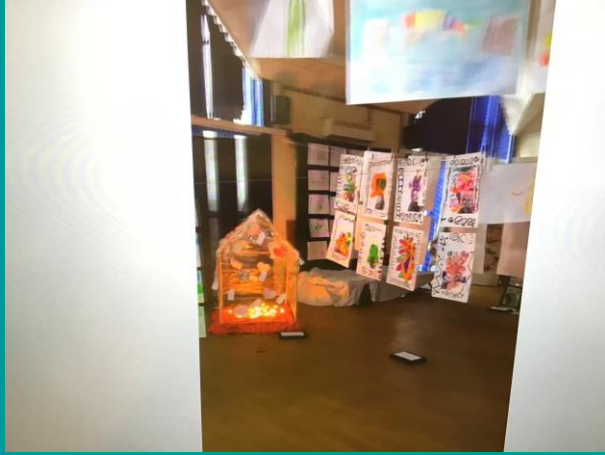




Bluebell Class

The children produced some fabulous art work which was enjoyed by all. This term Reception have been finding out about Africa; the different animals that live there and the different weather that the African Continent has. We have also used 'Baby Goes to Market' to help us with our maths, adding and taking away from different amounts. We have also been finding out about plant life cycles, planting seeds in our vegetable beds and a new wild flower meadow in Forest school. Many thanks to Erica and Georgia for providing the seeds for this. Please ensure that Forest school kits are adapted to the weather, children still require long sleeves and trousers but this can be in a light weight fabric for the summer.



Daisy Class



We have had a busy half term in Daisy Class! We have written stories based on the book, 'Yeti and the Bird' and 'The Dragon Machine'. Our history topic, How have toys changed?, has encouraged us to look at toys from the past and compare them to toys today. We have discovered that toys are very different from those used in the 1920s! We have also designed toys that we think children in 50 years might like to play with. We have started to find out more about plants and growing too. We have all planted sunflowers. We hope that they will grow really, really tall!





Poppy Class



This term Poppy class have been learning about the Anglo Saxons and have made some, very messy, wattle and daub models. We began with some plasticine and lolly sticks, then wove the pipe cleaners in and out of the lolly sticks to make our frame. We then mixed straw, clay and water together and pasted it onto the frame and finally left them to dry.

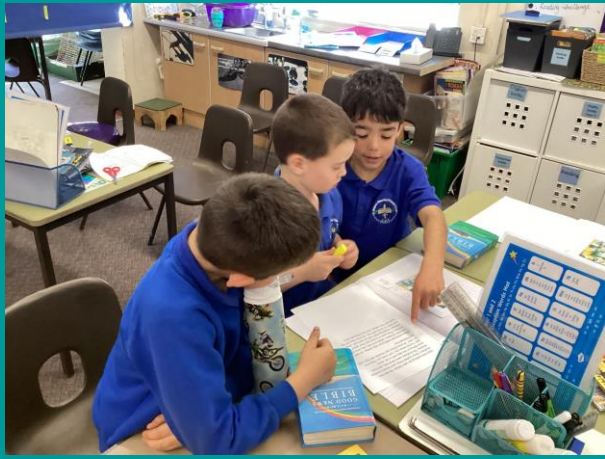
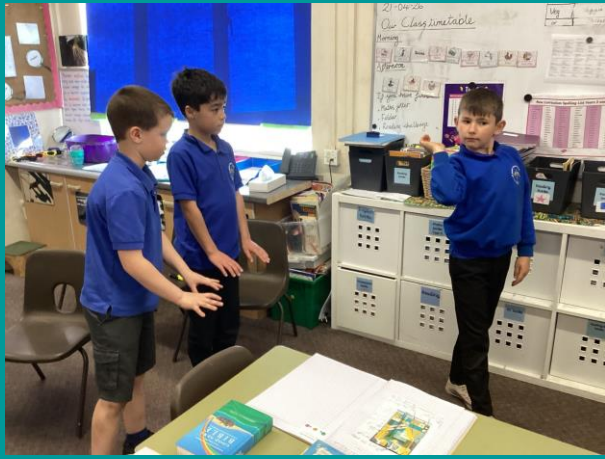
