








Robin Class







In English, year 2 have been reading the story Meerkat Mail. They have written their own postcards and learnt about statements and commands. They have also focused on writing their own diary entry, including the T's that they have covered so far.





Year 1 and Reception have read the key texts Handa's Surprise and The Tiny Seed. They have enjoyed sequencing the stories, thinking about what comes first, next, then and finally. They also observed and wrote about how the seed changed throughout the seasons. Reception are progressing so well with their phonics – they have now started learning set 2 sounds! I am so proud of the children's progress and their love for learning – they are always so enthusiastic and are applying their sounds learnt in phonics into their writing.





In Maths, we have been looking at shapes, including 3D shapes! Year 2 explored how many vertices, faces and sides each shape had, year 1 looked at patterns in shapes and Reception identified which shape was which.






In Computing, the children have had fun exploring how to use a mouse and a trackpad on the laptop. In Geography they found out all about Cardiff and even drew their own maps! In Science, year 2 explored the question 'What do animals need to live through winter in the forest?' They enjoyed finding different microhabitats in our outside area! Year 1 and Reception looked at Seasons and what types of weather are associated with each.





In PE the children have been doing gymnastics with Mr T on Fridays and fundamental movement skills on Wednesdays. They have been working hard on their balances and negotiating space. In RE they have been looking at the Easter story and have been thinking about Justice in our worship sessions.
