I can't believe the year's almost over! Chairing our PTA for the last three terms has been a huge amount of fun and incredibly rewarding. St Briavels families have managed to raise over £5,000 with events including the PJ nights, 2<sup>nd</sup> hand uniform sales, the Games Afternoon, Parents Dinner, sponsored walk, discos and talents shows, the Christmas fayre and concert, Back to School BBQ, Rags2Riches etc etc – and this figure doesn't even include the £500 worth of book vouchers thanks to our incredibly successful Book Fair! I hope there's been at least one event you and the children have been able to attend and more importantly enjoyed!

I hope you agree that we've spent the funds well. Alongside the outlay for events this is where the money has gone: we had the rusted gate by the Bluebell entrance fixed; each classroom now has a dedicated iPad and we bought a new steam mop for the Hall. If you weren't aware, every year the PTA buy the Leavers Hoodies which are given to the outgoing Years 6s at the Leavers Assembly. Throughout the year we match the amount each Class Cake Sale makes — usually around £100. Your fundraising also enabled the Year 6 leavers to enjoy a pizza lunch after their service at Gloucester Cathedral. Recently I asked each of the teachers to let me know what's at the top of their Classroom Wish List and we're now on the road to getting them what they need (it seems to be mainly sorting out the White Boards!). I'll let you know the details as soon as I can. As you can see the money the PTA raises is very important to the school and much appreciated.

The big project this year has been Ground Force - smartening up the playground and creating the outside area (STILL no name – it would be great to have one before the start of next term if you have a flash of inspiration). I've been genuinely humbled by the amount of time and effort which has gone into this both from families and staff. It just shows what can be achieved when we come together as a team. I've absolutely loved being part of it and hope you have too!

The Back to School BBQ will be our next event – the preliminary date for this is Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> September with more details to follow once this is confirmed with the Castle. Our postponed Treasure Hunt will go ahead on that morning with the winners announced at the BBQ.

The AGM will be held in September (date TBC) straight after school and it would be great to see as many parents/carers there as possible to share ideas for future events and decide how the funds raised should be spent. The PTA will provide childcare for the duration of the meeting so I hope you can come along, have a cuppa and a chat and help shape the future of our PTA.

I'd like to say a big thank you to Christine Wakerley for all her hard work as PTA treasurer and wish her all the best as she follows her daughter in leaving the school. Secondly thanks to Louise Taylor who is standing down as Secretary. Replacement Trustees will be announced shortly.

Lastly farewell to the Year 6s as they head off to pastures new – you're a fantastic bunch and we wish you well in your new schools. Best wishes to Nicola Dutton as she leaves us, she's been an absolute pleasure to work alongside. And a HUGE au revoir to the inimitable Mrs Ricketts!
