Dear All,

Thanks for your cooperation this term with all the measures we have needed to take to ensure the continued safety of our school community. I really appreciate your support and am pleased to report that we have managed to remain free from Covid-19 so far. I am aware that it continues to be a significant risk and we will continue to maintain our enhanced cleaning procedures, handwashing routines, separation of classes whilst inside and social distancing measures. Despite the different approach we have had to take, it has been fabulous to have the majority of our children in school and learning. We have assessed the gaps and teaching has been addressing this whilst covering our planned curriculum. Our children are remarkably adaptable to the new routines and this is now 'normal'.

We are planning to go ahead with our parents meetings as previously planned, although this is now going to be remotely. We will offer a virtual meeting or telephone call during the week beginning 9th November. This will be an opportunity for you to ask any questions and for your child's class teacher to let you know where they are with their learning. Further details have been emailed to you. This is an important part of our relationship with you and if you feel that there are any difficulties that this may cause you then please get in touch with your child's class teacher so we can work to ensure you are able to access this 'meeting'.

Thank you for responding to our consultation about lunchtime. We have had overwhelming support to bring our bubbles together at this time of day. As the seasons change and it gets colder we are hoping to be able to provide hot meals most days during the next term. A new menu will be available on Parentpay as soon as we have it available. Please don't forget, if you think you may be eligible for free school meals, please apply here: www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals. Even if your child receives free school meals during the Reception and KS1 years as part of the universal offer of free school meals, if you are in receipt of benefits you may be eligible to claim free school meals which gives the school additional funding to support your child's learning. We would strongly encourage you to please do this.

Our enquiry learning is going well and our questions will be the same as we continue to explore them over a longer period of time. This is to enable us to go deeper into the learning without being rushed. Our children are enjoying finding out and are inevitably, coming up with more questions!

It is obviously now the time to start thinking about hats, scarves and gloves and we ask that you please label all these items with your child's name so that we can reunite any lost items with their rightful owner. If you don't have time for sewing nametapes, please use a sharpie or even a biro! There is nothing more frustrating than losing warm clothes when it's cold outside.

I continue to keep a close eye on the news and will keep you posted should there be any further developments. Try to enjoy the break, rest and relax if at all possible. Take care everyone.





Please note that after half term, the road in red on the map below will be closed. Gloucestershire Highways suggested diversion is in blue. Given the traffic in the mornings it might be quicker to do the Newland, Clearwell, Stowe Mork route past the quarry down to Bigsweir and along by the river.

The road will be fully closed (24/7) from 2nd Nov to 27th Nov between County boundary and Swanpool Wood.
