We have training planned to help staff improve the playtimes and lunch breaks with our children and the school council will be involved in reviewing the available play equipment. Part of our INSET day for staff spent time looking at Guy Claxton's Learning Power Approach and how we can begin to tailor the learning we offer to our children to meet their future needs which we know are beyond passing knowledge recall tests. We had chance to explore what our children will need to be skilled in and how we can ensure that we teach these skills as an integral part of the curriculum offered across the WFF. I will give more information about this at the meetings planned for later this term and in each newsletter but one of the most powerful messages was regarding the use of the word '**yet**'. If you could also use this word when your child tackles something new or unfamiliar I am sure we will begin to see an impact. So, for instance, if your child tells you they can't do something, add the word 'yet' to the end of their sentence and ask how they can be helped to achieve. We will be using 'yet' to support new learning and helping children to raise their expectations that they will be able to achieve as we work on promoting our positive learning mindset.
